## **Lone Star Infrastructure Completes Track Resurfacing Project for Local Middle School**

(Austin, Texas) – Lone Star Infrastructure (LSI), developer of State Highway 130, gathered this afternoon with Dahlstrom Middle School students and faculty for a ribbon cutting ceremony to unveil the school's new track. Lone Star Infrastructure, along with help from its contractor KBDJ and Industrial Asphalt Inc., made the track restoration possible.

The school improvements kick off LSI's 2007 community improvement program. Over the next few months, LSI will partner with Science Hall Elementary School and Hemphill Elementary School, both in Hays Consolidated ISD, to provide improvements to their campuses.

When LSI approached the principal of Dahlstrom Middle School about a partnership, the run-down track was immediately identified as a priority. The track was overgrown with grass, had an uneven surface and left students susceptible to falls. Instead of using their own track, the Dahlstrom athletic department had to bus its students to the local high school to use its track.

"As part of our commitment to improve the communities along the SH 130 corridor, we are eager for the students to be able to practice on their own campus," said Danielle Allen, public information officer for Lone Star Infrastructure.

Hilda Gartzke, principal of Dahlstrom Middle School, added, "This track is a great benefit to our students and staff at Dahlstrom Middle School. Not only will it benefit our school, but it will also allow the community to enjoy the benefits of an active lifestyle." According to Gartzke, the local YMCA will also utilize the new track.

Lone Star Infrastructure commissioned its sub-contractor KBDJ to help complete the track for Dahlstrom. A limestone quarry located a mile and half from the middle school, KDBJ and Industrial Asphalt Inc. donated materials and executed the project. "Dahlstrom Middle School and its students are our neighbors," said Jill Shackelford, a principal of KBDJ. "When we heard about the project to restore the track, we immediately wanted to help any way we could. We're longtime residents of the area, and we are always eager to help improve our community. And no one in our community is more deserving than our schools and our children."
